- Grant facility managed by the ECREEE Secretariat (ECREEE-SEC) in cooperation with its National Focal Institutions (NFIs) in West Africa
- makes available co-funding for small and medium-scale RE&EE investments and businesses (see financing windows)
- Focus particularly but not exclusively on rural and peri-urban areas
- ECREEE undertakes regular **demand-driven competitive call for proposals**
- Eligible applicants are private companies, municipalities, and private companies, NGOs and cooperatives
- The participation of local project partners from West Africa is obligatory.
- Contributes to **action line 2 of the ECOWAS/UEMOA white paper** which called for an innovation fund for at least 200 RE&EE pilot projects.

Financing Window 2 - Business Development (max. 50.000 EUR co-funding per project)

- Business support activities for SMEs and ESCOs (e.g. business plan development, capacity development)
- Promotion of south-south/north-south business to business partnerships
- RE&EE business forums on specific RE&EE technologies and services




EREF applications per country in % of total




Received EREF funding requests & indicated co-funding


Proposals by EREF Financing Windows




Types of EREF applicants in % of total








EREF concept notes by technologies and interventions




EREF concept notes per technology & intervention (not all included)

Figure 1.1 EREF Organizational Structure











Figure 1.2 The EREF Project Management Cycle (max. 24 months)
